MOD Referral – South Perisher Alpine Lodge, Perisher MOD 10113 (DA 42-8-2006 MOD 3)

I refer to the above development application (DA) modification forwarded to the National Parks and Wildlife Service (NPWS) for provision of comments in accordance with *State Environmental Planning Policy (Kosciuszko National Park - Alpine Resorts) 2007* (SEPP). In providing these comments consideration has been had to the *National Parks and Wildlife Act 1974*, the Kosciuszko Plan of Management 2006 (KNP PoM) and the *Biodiversity Conservation Act 2016* (BC Act) and any other applicable legislation. Accordingly, we provide the following comments:

1. Leasing and KNP Plan of Management

- 1.1 NPWS Property and Commercial Team have advised that the proposed works are permissible under the Lease held by the proponent.
- 1.2 The relevant provisions of the KNP Plan of Management have been considered and the works comply.

2. BC Act and minimising impacts to natural values

- 2.1 It is noted that the works as proposed do not impact on native vegetation and do not involve ground disturbance.
- 2.2 It is noted that the DA does not address the BC Act. The Department is to address the BC Act in its assessment. NPWS can provide further advice if required.
- 2.3 If native vegetation removal is required for an Asset Protection Zone, then this must be considered under the BC Act and further consultation with NPWS is required (Please note: this is not consent for further vegetation management just a request for further consultation). We note there is mapped potential threatened species habitat close to the building.
- 2.4 Works must not impact on native vegetation, including stockpiles, material storage, parking and waste management placement.
- 2.5 All waste management receptors must be able to be covered to ensure waste cannot blow away or must be emptied or removed from site each day.

3. Other matters

- 3.1 I note that NPWS has also considered the following matters in its assessment:
 - (i) That Aboriginal Cultural Heritage is not considered required if there is no ground disturbance and no tree removal. However, we recommend that consent

- condition D16 of the original approval is reworded to include legislation and departmental name changes.
- (ii) That South Perisher Alpine Lodge is not considered to be heritage listed on the SEPP.
- (iii) There are no impacts to municipal services and no increase to stormwater drainage.
